Even mon important than the length of crimple Sound, though of course dependent on it, is reption, the length of exterbles. Here again we have only two degrees, long a chort, and the changing patterns other up of long a chort explables is, one feels, a fundamental feature of the language in the same way as the rise a face in pitch a far more so than is the case in English or any other modern European language.

It is impossible to give prove this assertion seintifically without long a careful researches in the laboratory, and it will therefore have to stand as the authors' subjective impression of the language. Since they have had mither the time may the facilities for extension reperimental work.



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
